2020 Subdivision Garage Sale

The annual subdivision garage sale will be held on Saturday, September 19th. As you may recall, the garage sale was moved to the third Saturday in September last year.

We are still looking for a chairperson for the garage sale. If you would like to volunteer to help your subdivision, this is an easy volunteer position.

Past Due Dues Collection

While most neighbors paid their 2019 annual dues of \$25, **80 of the 420 homeowners have not yet paid their dues** - - which were due July 1, 2019. It is critical that all homeowners pay their dues - - including past due dues. MVEHA is required to purchase insurance to cover the common areas. Also, the cost of maintenance of the entrances and the areas around the perimeter of the subdivision has increased. MVEHA is only able to maintain basic services with the cooperation of all homeowners by paying their <u>nominal</u> \$25 annual dues. **Please pay your dues promptly.**

Landscaping

As noted above, landscaping costs will increase in 2020. The prior landscaping company, Sierra Landscaping, is not able to continue due to a serious health problem with the owner (who has since recovered nicely!!). The new contractor, Greenline Landscaping, will begin work as soon as the Covid-19 restrictions are lifted. In the interim, the MVEHA officers will be mowing, fertilizing, and weeding the entrances.

As always, we welcome any volunteers who are willing to plant and maintain summer annuals at one of the entrances (petunias, marigolds, etc.). Because there is no water supply at the entrances, the summer flowers will require regular watering. Most neighbors adjacent to the entrances generously allow us to fill watering cans for this purpose. If you are interested in planting annuals this year, call Kathy Bauhof at (248) 515-5307.

Real Estate Information

Home sales in Mt. Vernon and surrounding subdivisions have slowed substantially because of the Covid-19 virus. Ron MacClennan of Century 21 Town & Country Realty reports that from March 2019 through April 2020 there have been only 11 sales - - nine have closed and two are pending. Sale prices for the nine homes sold in this 13-month period range from \$252,500 to \$320,000, and pending sale prices are \$249,900 and \$349,900 (average for all 11 is \$295,611). For comparison, the average sale price for 2017 was \$257,919 and for 2019 \$271,429. This will be a watershed year for housing - and for the entire economy.

Annual Reminders

• <u>Slow Down</u> - Please slow down. With schools cancelled, there are many more young children out and about. Sometimes kids are not as careful as they should be. As a result, you must be careful while driving in the sub. The speed limit is 25 mph!

- <u>Slow Down Signs</u> MVEHA has three "*Drive Like Your Kids Live Here*" yard signs if you would like to borrow one. Dick Beuther at (248) 689-1254 can deliver one to your home.
- <u>Trash Pick Up</u> If you see trash, especially at the entrances, please pick it up. Also, be responsible and pick up trash around your home and in the common areas when you are out for a walk. Further, make sure you trash and garbage is secured so that it doesn't blow around the neighborhood.
- <u>Dog Poop</u> It is your responsibility to pick up after your dog - both in the subdivision and along the common areas along John R and Wattles. Please be courteous to your neighbors and always pick up after your puppy. As with the stay at home directive, the vast majority of our dog walkers are responsible. Thank you.
